Miramax Films, 1996, 108 mins, rated R for drug use and strong language. Perhaps the first commercial feature film made by an artist about an artist, the film tells the story of Brooklyn-born Jean Michel Basquiat's rise to fame and eventual destruction in the fast-paced New York City art world

of the 80s. Beginning his career with graffiti art signed "Samo", Basquiat was discovered and mentored by Andy Warhol, but success came at a price. Directed by Julian Schnabel, starring Jeffrey Wright, David Bowie, Gary Oldman, Parker Posey, Courtney Love, Benicio del Toro. \$5 suggested donation. The Mystery of Henry Darger. Wellspring Media, 2004, 81 mins, unrated

Henry Darger was a reclusive custodian in Chicago until shortly before his death in 1973 at the age of 81. His landlord found in his apartment what would prove to be a trove of some 15,000 drawings

and paintings, many done in meticulous detail on both sides of long rolls of paper. This work, done in secret over 40 years, illustrated a fantastic epic whose heroines were the figures of half-naked girls traced from mail-order catalogs. This award-winning documentary tells the story of Darger's sad life on the edge of insanity, and attempts to show how he produced a remarkable and unsettlingly beautiful body of work, much of it now housed at New York's American Folk Art Museum.
